



Topic 1: Federal Funding Implementation

Session Overview

This breakout session will review how CSO has pushed NOAA to improve funding processes in 2024, our successes, and short-term next steps.

We will discuss what topics we'd like to prioritize in 2025, if there are new issues that have come up in 2024, and how we build a coalition to make a stronger case to NOAA for systemic change.

Discussion Prompts

1. Which is the most important way to improve funding implementation at NOAA? Why?
 - a. Communications from NOAA
 - b. Changes to NOAA bureaucratic processes
 - c. Getting GMD to review/approve quicker.
2. What are the biggest specific challenges you face in getting funding from NOAA?
3. Who else is having these problems (non-CZMPs)? How do we reach them?

Topic 2: Ocean Management

Session Overview

This session will focus on sustaining and expanding state leadership in ocean policy during the next Congress and administration. We will review and prioritize the federal programs that coastal states work with and offshore issues that coastal programs are confronting.

Discussion Prompts

1. How should CSO amplify the importance of working with coastal states and ROPs?
2. Where are the opportunities for expanded federal partnerships? Where are there vulnerabilities?
3. Who are key national allies?

Topic 3: Environmental Justice Policy

Session Overview

This breakout session will focus on implementation & communication strategies for CSO's environmental justice policy that will be voted on as a part of this fall member meeting.

We always intended for at least some version of this policy to be public facing, to assist CSO & the CZMPs in their articulation of how EJ fits into their work.

Discussion Prompts

1. How should we best communicate out the key themes of the EJ policy (who needs to see this)?
2. How can we tailor public-facing versions of the EJ policy for your use?
3. What should we prioritize when it comes to implementation of the EJ policy?
4. How should we track implementation progress and hold one another accountable?
